Things to Know Before Making Class Choices:

- **Academic Classes:** *Homework is Mandatory!* Students will be allowed only “1” missed homework assignment. More than “1” missed assignment will result in dismissal from the class and placement in Board Games/Study Hall for that class hour. The reason for this is that the teachers work very hard preparing to teach your children and it is disrespectful to the teacher and the other students when someone is not prepared and their assignments are not completed.
- **Drop/Add Classes:** Wednesday, September 10th is the last day to drop and then add another class. However, class availability will be determined by whether or not the class has reached maximum capacity. Once the class is dropped you give up your place in that class and students on the waiting list will be offered that spot
- **Class Fees:** Class fees can only be refunded if the class is dropped by Wednesday, September 10th. Classes dropped after that date are not eligible for refunds.
- **Supplies:** Parents are responsible for purchasing supplies requested by the teacher.
- **Recent Changes:** We have made some changes concerning infants, toddlers, Pre-K, Kindergarten, and 1st grade students. The changes are as follows:
 1. Nursery: 4 weeks - 1 year old
 2. Toddlers: 2 years - 3 years old
 3. Pre-K thru Kindergarten: 4 years - 5 years old (children 6 years old who are in Kindergarten will be accepted into this class.
 4. 1st grade students MUST be 6 years old by August 1, 2008. “No Exceptions”
- **All Children** (Infants-12th Grade) must be assigned to a class for ALL hours attending Co-op.
